




Figure 5: Outgoing credit mobility by field of study, based on recent graduate surveys (2013-14 cohort).




Figure 3: Top 10 destination countries for Dutch degree students in 2013-14, excl. USA (1,900) and Sweden (271).



Success factors recognition

- Semester windows
- Organisation and planning
- Process
- Student centred





Semester windows

- Many Programs have a semester windows for studying abroad
- Curricula contain a minor for electives which can be replaced by studies abroad
- Recognition for courses abroad as replacement for electives is quite easily
- Replacements of core topics more exceptional





Organisation and planning

- Carefully planned by students and institutions
- Use of learning agreements
- Permission prior to exchange
- Independently organised

 Not only within Europe but also outside of Europe





Process

- Exam committees formal responsible, in practice they monitor the process
- Planning and recognition often delegated to special officers or student advisors.
- Student advisors can discuss options with students and secure consistency in the process





Student centred

- If something goes wrong...
 - Effort is done to fit the results in some way in the curriculum
 - Or courses are added as extra course
- If course have appropriate level they can be included as additional course in the Diploma supplement >
 Students in NL are normally allowed to take extra courses

Recognition is only the last step

- It is also very much about:
 - Well written learning outcomes
 - Assessable websites/information
- Recognition starts with:
 - Prior information about a course
 - Prior information about the level
 - Prior information about the place within a curriculum of a course
- After mobility:
 - Transcript of records including a grading table

Recognition is only the last step

- Better information → Less problems with recognition
- Usage of Bologna tools would improve recognition a lot!





Improving Recognition by using Bologna tools

- Course catalogues:
 - Available in English (at least)
 - Well written learning outcomes
 - Information about complete curriculum
- Grading table:
 - Include grading tables on transcript of records
